 - (1) notes that the report of the Constitutional Review Committee on **Review of section 25 of the Constitution, 1996** (Announcements, Tablings and Committee Reports, 15 November 2018, p 4) was adopted by the Assembly and the Council on 4 and 5 December 2018 respectively, recommending that Parliament –
 - (a) amends section 25 of the Constitution to make explicit that which is implicit in the Constitution, with regards to expropriation of land without compensation, as a legitimate option for land reform, so as to address the historic wrongs caused by the arbitrary dispossession of land, and in so doing ensure equitable access to land and further empower the majority of South Africans to be productive participants in ownership, food security and agricultural reform programs;
 - (b) urgently establishes a mechanism to effect the necessary amendment to the relevant part of section 25 of the Constitution; and
 - (c) tables, processes and passes a Constitutional Amendment Bill before the end of the Fifth Democratic Parliament in order to allow for expropriation without compensation;
 - (2) establishes an *ad hoc* committee in terms of Rule 253, the committee to –
 - (a) initiate and introduce legislation amending section 25 of the Constitution;

- (b) have regard to the recommendations as contained in the Constitutional Review Committee report;
 - (c) consist of 11 voting members of the Assembly, as follows: African National Congress 6, Democratic Alliance 2, Economic Freedom Fighters 1 and other parties 2;
 - (d) consist of 14 non-voting members of the Assembly, as follows: African National Congress 2, Democratic Alliance 1, Economic Freedom Fighters 1 and other parties 10;
 - (e) exercise those powers as set out in Rule 167 that may assist it in carrying out its task; and
- (3) sets the deadline by which the Committee is to report to 31 March 2019.

PART E

Life enhancement benefit

Liability of Administrator in respect of life enhancement benefit

47. (1) Subject to this Act, the Administrator shall be liable to provide a life enhancement benefit to injured persons in respect of non-pecuniary losses limited to payments for a serious injury as contemplated in subsection (2) and shall be paid by way of a lump sum.

(2) Assessment of a serious injury shall be based on a prescribed method adopted after consultation with medical service providers and shall be reasonable in ensuring that injuries are assessed in relation to the circumstances of the claimant.

(3) The assessment shall be carried out by a medical practitioner registered as such under the Health Care Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974).

CLAUSE 55

(5) A claimant may appeal to the Appeals Committee in terms of section 63 against any decision of the Administrator.

CLAUSE 63

1. On page 28, in line 43, to omit subsection (6) and to substitute:

(6) A claimant who feels aggrieved by a decision of the Appeals Committee may, within six weeks after the date of the decision, apply to the division of the High Court which has jurisdiction, for relief, and shall at the same time give written notice to the Appeals Committee of his or her intention to so apply.

(7) The division of the High Court contemplated in subsection (6) may consider the merits of the complaint made to the Appeals Committee and on which the Appeals Committee's decision was based, and may make any order it deems fit.

(8) Subsection (7) shall not affect the court's power to decide that sufficient evidence has been adduced on which a decision can be arrived at, and to order that no further evidence shall be adduced.
