



RABS INTO 6TH PARLIAMENT

Aprav just learned that the National Assembly (proposed and lead by the ANC Chief Whip) has suspended National Assembly Rules 333(2) and 351(2). These rules have been in place since 26 May 2016 and would have resulted in all Bills and other unfinished business lapsing, when the House is dissolved on 20 March 2019. This all happened with most key stakeholders being unaware 😞

The impact of this development is that the Road Accident Benefit Scheme (RABS) Bill, that is currently on Parliament's Order Papers under 'Further Business' (below the line) will be transferred from the current 5th Parliament to the 6th Parliament after the election.
